

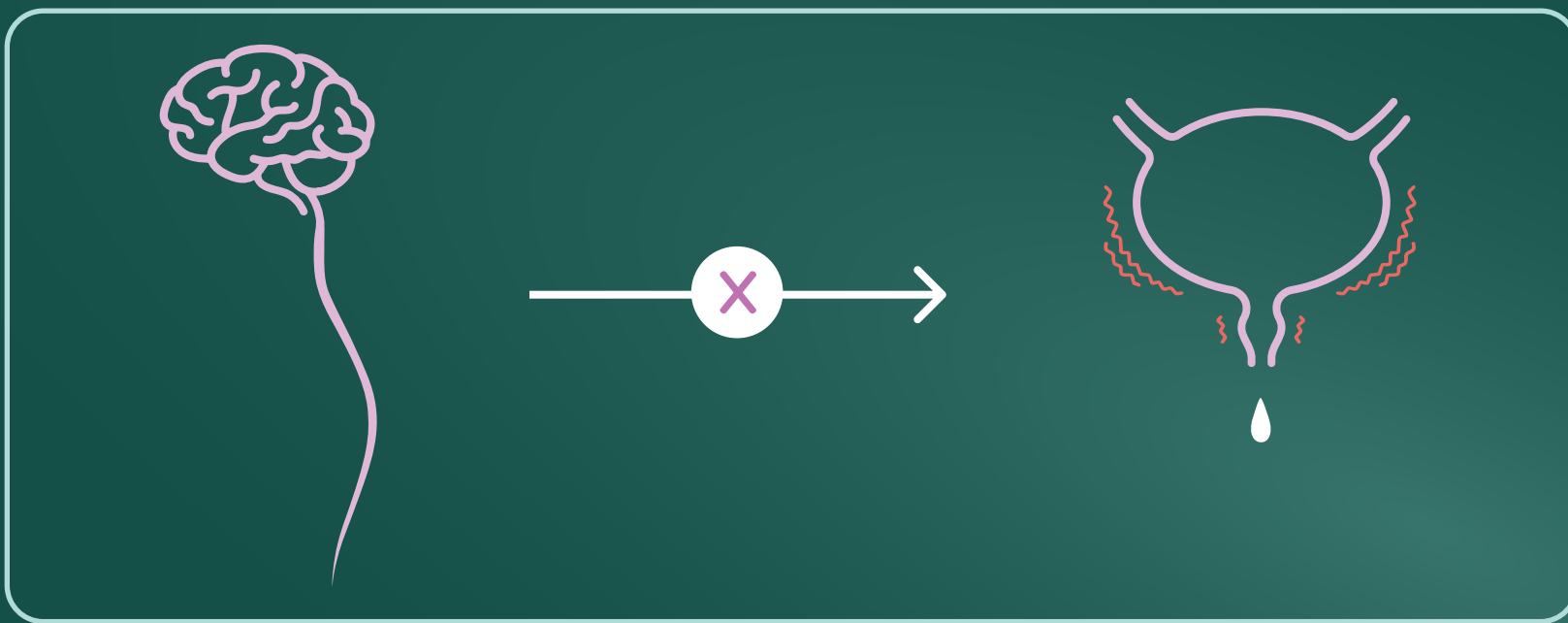


Neurogenic Bladder

What is Neurogenic Bladder?

Neurogenic bladder occurs when an injury or disease disrupts the electrical signals between your nervous system and your bladder.



Did you know?

Neurogenic bladder can be caused by nerve damage from birth defects, brain or spinal cord injuries, stroke, MS, Parkinson's disease, or infections.

Symptoms of Neurogenic Bladder:

- A urinary tract infection (UTI).
- Loss of bladder control.
- Peeing more than usual.
- Leaking or dribbling pee.
- Sudden urges to pee.
- Inability to completely empty your bladder.

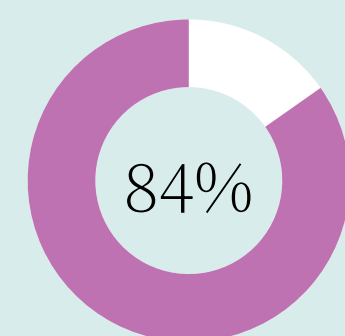
